**NEW PICTURE BOOKS** I love seeing new picture books. Here are new ones sent by publishers, some just right for Father's Day:

**ALPACAS WITH MARACAS** by Matt Cosgrove (Scholastic). A welcome follow-up to *Macca the Alpaca*. Energetic, very funny illustrations and page-turning fun in the rhyming text. Great to read aloud and share with young readers who will delight in the humour.

**AMAZING AUSTRALIAN WOMEN** by Pamela Freeman & Sophie Beer (Lothian). Stories of twelve Australian women who changed the world. Inviting and colourful presentation to inspire today's girls, with lots of useful information.

**AT THE END OF HOLYROOD LANE** by Dimity Powell & Nicky Johnston (EK). How to cope with storms that bring thunder and rain and keep the sunshine in your life. Appealing illustrations in a book that will inspire confidence.

**BARNEY** by Catherine Jinks & Stephen Michael King (Scholastic). Two award-winning creators together in this delightful book about a lovable family dog who loves everything. A winner to read to small children. Very simple text and wonderful illustrations, as good as any book by one of my favourite illustrators.

**THE CAT WANTS KITTENS** by P Crumble & Lucinda Gifford (Scholastic). Kevin is a bored cat who rules the roost. How will he cope when two kittens move in? Very amusing insight into a fussy feline with striking illustrations.

**CHARLIE** by Ronjojoy Ghosh (Puffin). Charlie the lion is far too clever to sit around all day in the zoo. He doesn't want to eat people because they're too bony. He wears a disguise and goes out to explore the world. His adventures are entertaining and amusing, and unusual for a lion.

**CICADA** by Shaun Tan (Lothian). Another superb masterpiece from acclaimed award-winner, with appeal on many levels to young and old readers. Thought-provoking and sometimes humorous insight into a life unrecognised and unrewarded. Through metamorphosis Cicada escapes the drudgery of the human world. Brilliant illustrations.

**DIGBY & CLAUDE** by Emma Allen & Hannah Sommerville (NLA). This timely story of redevelopment in cities is about how two friends cope with the change. Includes fascinating factual information about Australian homes.

**GRANDPA'S SPACE ADVENTURE** by Paul Newman & Tom Jellett (Puffin). Grandpas tell tall stories to help you deal with childhood fears. I defy any adult to read this and not laugh out loud. It's hilarious. The lively illustrations extend the fun.

**THE GUM FAMILY FINDS HOME** by Tania McCartney & Christina Booth (NLA). This fascinating book takes readers on a tour of Australia's geological wonders with a family of koalas looking for a more stable home than their gum tree. Lots of information and striking illustrations.

**THE HAPPINESS BOX** by Mark Greenwood & Andrew McLean (Walker). This is a very moving true story of prisoners of war who wrote a book for the children in Changi prison. Sensitive watercolour illustrations. The original book has become a National Treasure.

**THE HEART OF A WHALE** by Anna Pignataro (Scholastic). This heartwarming book is a love story told with gentle, evocative language. Sea creatures join in what looks like a dreamy ocean dance in the beautiful illustrations.

**HOW DID I GET HERE?** by Philip Bunting (Omnibus), I'm a fan of Bunting's quirky and simple illustrations. This more complex but still very simple book tells the story of how we got here. A very entertaining look at evolution and the journey of man.

**LUCIA & LAWRENCE** by Joanna Francis (New Frontier). Two very different children develop a firm friendship, celebrating their differences. 'Warm and bubbly' illustrations, just like their friendship.

**MY DAD IS A ROBOT** by Matt Cosgrove (Koala). From alpacas to robots! The author's children obviously inspired this book. A child imagines everything his father does is because he's a robot. Colourful and fun.

**MR PEGG'S POST** by Elena Topouzoglou (New Frontier). A love of the sea and the author's childhood memories of Greece inspired this story about helping people and making new friends and what it's like living in a lighthouse.

**MY STOREE** by Paul Russell & Aska (EK). With his head full of stories a boy with dyslexia finally finds a way to share them. An inspiring story based on the author's life with lively and engaging illustrations.

**SOMETHING FOR FLEUR** by Catherine Pelosi & Caitlin Murray (Lothian). Guessing what's inside a gift box is filled with anticipation. Readers are invited to join Fleur in guessing what her birthday gift is.

**THINGS MY PA TOLD ME** by Anthony Bertini & Jonathan Bentley (Little Hare). With the subtitle, 'From Him, to Me, to You', this is a warmly told and illustrated story of fatherhood. A book to grow up with which will resonate with life's journey.

**WANT TO PLAY TRUCKS?** by Ann Stott and Bob Graham (Walker). Jack likes trucks. Alex likes dolls. They are friends though and finally find something they both like. Gorgeous illustrations by a multi-award-winner, one of our best and most loved.

**WISP, A Story of Hope** by Zana Fraillon & Grahame Baker-Smith (Lothian). This beautifully illustrated and powerful book highlights the plight of a child refugee. It inspires hope in dark times. Strongly recommended.

Finally, **book early for the course with Glenda Millard**. Also visitors welcome. Come and see the collection of brilliant artwork and the library. Happy Book Week!
